| Salvia ' Ostfriesland' | R | Slender spires of intense violet-blue flowers from July to September above clumps of wrinkled, mid-green leaves. |
| Salvia Superba 'Merleau |  |  |
| Rose' | R | A compact perennial with fragrant mid-green, lance shaped foliage and slender racemes of small rose-pink lipped flowers which have dark purple bracts in summer and autumn. |
| Alstromeria ' Indian Summ | r' B | Masses of exotic looking orange and yellow flowers with dark bronze foliage. Good cut flower with long flowering period-May to September. Height 2.5 feet and hardy. |
| Alstromeria 'Summer Lovely | y' B | Masses of red flowers. Good cut flower with long flowering period June to Sept Height 2 feet |
| Achillea 'Cerise Queen' | R | Masses of pink flowers in summer months for the sunny border loved by bees on tall slightly aromatic stems. Ideal for back of the border. Height and spread 2-2.5 feet. Loved by bees |
| Achillea ' Cloth of Gold' | R | Masses of bright yellow flowers in the summer atop greyish feathery leaves. Grows to 4 feet. Good for bees and other insects. Excellent back of border perennial |
| Heuchera | B | Various colours-good front of border plant-neat mounds of foliage |
| Rudbeckia ' Goldsturm' | R | A Clump forming perennial to 60 cm in height, with erect stems bearing narrowly ovate leaves and dark-eyed, deep yellow flowers No cottage garden is complete without this |
| Lythrum Virgatum | R | 'Rosy Gem' A clump-forming perennial to 1m tall, with erect, branched stems From early to late summer has bright rose pink flowers in slender, upright spikes |


| Erigeron Karvinskianus | R | ‘ Mexican Fleabane’ Masses of small daisies, emerging white, then turning pink, with yellow centres, give this low growing plant an unusual, two-tone effect. It has a long flowering period, from May to October. |

| Imperata ' Red Baron' | B | Stunning blood red spikes which fade to bright green at the base make this grass a spectacular addition to the perennial border |
| Liatris ' Spicata; | R | Known as 'Button Snakewort' is a herbaceous perennials with narrow, grass-like foliage and erect, bottlebrush-like spikes of pink flowers |
| Digitalis 'Lutea' | B | Rare and usual. An upright, herbaceous perennial to 60 cm with narrowly oval, bright green, glossy leaves. Spires of soft yellow, trumpet-shaped flowers are produced in early to midsummer |
| Camassia leichtlinii |  | Bulbous perennial bears spikes of star-shaped blue flowers through grassy leaves. Large bulbs $£ 5$ per pot |
| Astilbe | R | Fluffy plumes appear above serrated, dark green leaves in early summer. The flowers are self-supporting and retain their colour for a few weeks. Suitable for a moist border, prefers a shady spot. Various colours available |
| Sanguisorba Tanna | B | Grows to 50 cms with thin pinnate leaves and above these slender stems carrying pink bottlebrush like flower heads from summer to late autumn. Unusual perennial |
| Verbena ' Bampton' | B | The bronze or purple-flushed foliage of 'Bampton' is held on slender stems for long periods throughout summer are topped with spikes of small violet-pink flowers. Once established, forms a light and airy clump -Height to 3 feet. Unusual perennial that has proved hardy over Shropshire winters |
